CALL TO ORDER

The City Council met in a regular session on Tuesday, April 10, 2018, at 5:01 p.m. in the City Council Chamber of the Civic Center, 6650 Beach Boulevard, Buena Park, California, Mayor Vaughn presiding.

The invocation was led by Reverend Mary P. Trainor, St. Joseph Episcopal Church.

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Vanderpool reported on the following:

Presentation on Human Trafficking by Tony Rackaukas, Orange County District Attorney – This item was postponed to a future meeting.

Jessica Lopez, Crime Prevention Specialist, presented information on the national "If You See Something, Say Something" campaign, to raise awareness of the importance of reporting suspicious activity to law enforcement agencies. Orange County's website www.keepocsafe.org, is a localized version of the "If You See Something, Say Something" campaign. The Police Department has created a postcard to distribute to the community with the acronym P.A.S.S. (Proactive; Attention; See Something; Say Something), to help keep the community safe. The postcards are available at the Police Department front counter, and will be available in Korean and Spanish soon. She reminded residents to call (714) 562-3902 to report suspicious activity, or 911 to report a crime in progress.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Mayor Vaughn announced the public may at this time address the members of the City Council on any matters within the jurisdiction of the City Council.

Delwin Lampkin, Buena Park resident, spoke about increased coyote sightings and pet attacks in the neighborhood. He attended an Orange County Board of Supervisors and California Fish and Wildlife Department Town Hall meeting on March 27, and found these agencies could not address his concerns, as they have no jurisdiction in this area. Mr. Lampkin commented that other cities such as Torrance, Palos Verdes, San Juan Capistrano, Huntington Beach and Hermosa Beach have an urban wildlife management program. He suggested working with the City to develop a program to educate the community on coyote habits, enact ordinances to prohibit feeding, find ways to discourage coyotes from entering the area and capture and release practices. Mayor Vaughn directed Mr. Lampkin to speak with Aaron France, Deputy City Manager.

Council Member Swift commented that the Town Hall Meeting was held the same day and time as the regular Buena Park City Council meeting, and the City Council was unable to attend. Jenny Higgins, Buena Park resident, extended an invitation to the Speech and Language Development Center Walk on April 29, at Knott's Berry Farm. 12. PUBLIC HEARING – ORDINANCE FOR DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

APPLICATION NO. DA16-007 & RESOLUTION FOR MODIFICATION OF CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. MCU18-28834 (MODIFYING CU-1273/ ADJ-170); RENOVATE AND EXPAND EXISTING THREE-STORY, 50-ROOM HOTEL TO 70-ROOMS, 70 TOTAL PARKING SPACES INCLUDING THREE MECHANICAL PARKING LIFT CLUSTERS, AND RELATED SITE IMPROVEMENTS, LOCATED AT 7921 ORANGETHORPE AVENUE (APN: 276-362-12; EAST 15 FEET OF 276-362-17) BUENA PARK, CALIFORNIA; AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO EXECUTE THE SAME ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF BUENA PARK
Staff report by Swati Meshram, PhD, AICP, Associate Planner

Purpose: To approve the expansion of existing three-story, 50-room hotel to 70-rooms, 70 total parking spaces including three mechanical parking lift clusters, and related site improvements, located at 7921 Orangethorpe Avenue. There is no budget impact with the approval of this item.

Recommended Action: 1) Adopt an Ordinance approving Development Agreement No. DA16-007; 2) Adopt a Resolution approving Modification to Conditional Use Permit No. MCU18-28834; and 3) Authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to execute the Development Agreement.

Council Member Swift requested clarification on whether she could participate in the discussion and act on this item, as it's in close proximity of her home. Interim City Attorney Shah stated Council Member Swift's home is not within 500 feet of the development, and there is no conflict. Mayor Vaughn announced that this was the time and place for a public hearing to consider a development agreement and modification of a conditional use permit for the renovation and expansion of an existing three-story hotel, parking spaces and mechanical parking lift clusters, called the public hearing to order at 6 p.m., and inquired if anyone present desired to speak. There being no one desiring to speak, Mayor Vaughn closed the public hearing.

Council Member Berry inquired about the breakdown of non-mechanical parking spaces. Dr. Meshram indicated in addition to the parking lifts, there are:

- 25 total non-mechanical parking spaces
- 16 are surface level (3 handicap)
- 12 remaining (4 compact and 8 regular parking spaces)

Council Member Berry asked how the vacant property located west of this project is currently zoned, and what are the two unlabeled rooms on the diagram. Dr. Meshram stated the vacant property has the same CG zoning, and the two unlabeled rooms are an existing laundry room and a storage room, both approved in 2000. She also mentioned that a parking attendant will be trained by the manufacturer to operate the lift to retrieve vehicles for guests.

Council Member Smith requested clarification that the parking attendant and not the guest will drive the vehicle onto the lift. He expressed concern and is opposed to the mechanical lift and the number of cars to be parked on the lot.

Council Member Swift asked what actions would be taken in the event of guest complaints or if the mechanical lift system fails. Dr. Meshram stated there are conditions of approval included in the development agreement, conditional use permit, and the owner will sign a covenant and agreement to maintain the lifts and ensure they are in working condition at all times. There is also standard language that extends beyond the parking lifts, stating if three or more complaints are received regarding the project, the City may consider revoking the conditional use permit.

13. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION REGARDING ADVISORY (AD HOC)

COMMITTEES OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Report by Adria M. Jimenez, MMC, City Clerk

City Clerk Jimenez explained that an ad-hoc committee is a temporary committee formally created by a legislative body (i.e., City Council, City Commissions, etc.), comprised of less than a quorum and not required to follow Brown Act meeting requirements, because it's less than a quorum of the legislative body. An ad hoc committee serves a limited purpose, is usually formed to address a single issue, not be perpetual, and dissolved once the task is accomplished.

Council Member Swift commented on ad hoc committees she's served on, such as the Buena Park Youth Theatre, Strategic Plan and Homelessness. The ad hoc committee presented findings and made recommendations to the City Council.

Mayor Vaughn commented that ad hoc committees are valuable, but she would like to see a shorter time frame.

Following discussion, the City Council agreed not to make any changes to their protocols, and to receive and file the report.

14. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION REGARDING THE ORANGE COUNTY

HERITAGE BLACK HISTORY PARADE WITH SCHOOL INVOLVEMENT

Report by Margaret Riley, Director of Community Services

Ms. Riley stated that the City has attended the parade the last couple of years, and this year, several Cultural and Fine Arts Commissioners also attended the annual event, held the first Saturday in February. The parade begins at 10 a.m., and runs along Anaheim Boulevard for about one mile. For the past two years, the City has used the horse and carriage (also used for the Christmas Tree Lighting). Immediately following the parade, the City participates in the Cultural Fair, which has vendor and food booths, live entertainment and a small health fair. The total cost for the event is \$785 (\$125 parade entry fee; \$160 booth fee; and \$500 horse and carriage fee).

Mayor Vaughn commented about the City committing to the event annually, and possible involvement from Buena Park Schools. She mentioned the event is in Anaheim, costs \$785, well attended by Buena Park residents, requires City Council and Commissioners time, and is a full work day for Staff.

Council Member Swift commented that she wasn't able to attend due to another obligation, and can't guarantee future attendance.

Council Member Berry commented about the first Saturday in February, and he would participate and supports the City's involvement in this event. He mentioned an earlier discussion about bringing back the Silverado Days parade, and suggested looking at the possibility of a "Kiddie Parade" approximately two blocks long, along the streets already closed in front of Peak Park. The kids (ballet, karate students, etc.), could march in the parade.

Council Member Smith commented in the past, the City held a Silverado Days Kiddie Parade on a Saturday, staged at Walter Knott Elementary School that traveled to Peak Park.

During discussion, the City Council questioned the need for the booth. It was stated the booth is to promote the City's art programs and events, such as the Art Festival and Jazz and Summer Concerts, etc. Council Member Swift inquired if the Cultural and Fine Arts Commission has a budget for this, and if so, they can make a recommendation to the City Council for consideration.

Following discussion, the City Council opposed committing to the annual event. Ms. Riley stated the City Council will receive a recommendation from the Commission regarding future participation in this event.

15. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION REGARDING THE CREATION OF A HOMELESS COMMITTEE
Report by Aaron France, Deputy City Manager

Mr. France clarified this item is to discuss and provide direction regarding the creation of a Homeless Commission (not committee), that would require regular meetings and staff participation like other City Commissions.

Council Member Swift stated the homeless committee started a couple of years ago, as an ad hoc committee consisting of herself and Mayor Vaughn. The ad hoc committee presented findings and recommendations to the City Council and was dissolved. She inquired about the driving force behind the proposed Commission, and its role or goal. Mayor Vaughn stated the newly formed Commission would work with the Buena Park Collaborative (Collaborative) and CityNet. Council Member Swift suggested a City staff member regularly attend the Collaborative meetings. Mayor Vaughn stated that may include attending several meetings, such as the steering committee and breakout meetings of smaller groups. She requested the Collaborative brief the City Council.

Council Member Smith commented to be cautious, as homelessness is a very sensitive issue. Mayor Vaughn stated one of the reasons the collaborative was formed was to be able to work together with different groups and organizations and pool resources.

Rebecca Kovacs, Buena Park resident, commented about her work with the Buena Park Collaborative, her association with other community groups, and is opposed to the City creating a homeless commission.

Joel Rosen, Director of Community Development, commented he and staff have attended several sub-committee and other meetings in support of community initiatives on homelessness.

Following discussion, the City Council opposed creating a homeless commission.

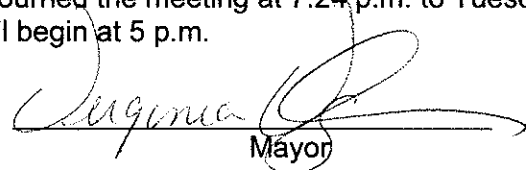
