#### STUDY SESSION (16-23)

#### 16. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION ON THE FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020 REVISED BUDGET

Presented by: Sung Hyun, Director of Finance

Director of Finance Hyun provided the following information on the FY 2019-2020 Revised Budget:

- Sales Tax was increased by \$828,500.
- Transient Occupancy Tax was decreased by \$500,000. The decrease reflects the revised opening dates of new hotels that were included in the original estimate.
- Electricity and Gas Utility Franchise Taxes were decreased by a total of \$100,000.
- Miscellaneous Revenue was increased by \$500,000 to reflect the public benefit fee from the Los Coyotes development.
- No provisions have been included in the revised budget for the anticipated new labor agreements at this time.

General Fund expenditure changes are:

- Fire Department was increased by \$161,860 to reflect the current contract with the Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA).
- Southeast Area Animal Control Authority (SEAACA) contract was increased by \$13,000.

Overall, the original approved FY 19-20 budget for the General Fund projected a deficit of (\$251,230) after factoring in savings from projected vacant positions. The revised FY 19-20 projects a surplus of \$906,660 for the General Fund after factoring in the same level of projected vacant positions.

The City Council approved the following Policy Issues:

- Visit Buena Park - retain part-time staff and move into operations from the Welcome Center, reduce advertising budget and increasing part-time budget.



- Public Works Department - \$7,500 purchase of a chain flail from the Sewer Fund.
- Public Works Department - ADA Improvements at various City parks.
- Public Works Department - Brush chipper from one-time general fund revenues - \$37,500.

17. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION REGARDING THE DALE STREET COMPLETE STREETS CONCEPTUAL DESIGN PLAN

Presented by: Jeff Townsend, Associate Engineer

Associate Engineer Townsend provided information on the project's background and grant awards, project location, explained separated bike lanes, reviewed conceptual plans, and possible next steps for the project: finalize plans, specifications and estimates; grant application for construction funds; and, go out to bid for construction competitive bidding. The estimated cost for all work is approximately \$550,000.

Mayor Pro Tem Smith asked if there are any concerns with the daycare center and on-street parking at the location.

Assistant City Manager France stated there are some concerns; however, the district superintendent, principal, and school staff are all supportive of the project.

After discussion, the City Council was supportive of the conceptual plan presented by staff.

18. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION REGARDING REVIEW OF CALTRANS RIGHT-OF-WAY MAINTENANCE AGREEMENTS

Presented by: Doug Brodowski, Acting Field Operations Manager

Acting Field Operations Manager Brodowski provided information on the City's Right-of-Way (ROW) Maintenance Agreements with Caltrans, some of which have been in effect since the early 1970's. Generally, the ROWs maintenance agreements cover the following types of work: general landscaping, pothole repair, concrete patches, etc. The City and Caltrans have similar agreements in place for the 91-Freeway and 5-Freeway on and off-ramps. The 91-Freeway agreement at the pedestrian bridge overpass near Corey Elementary School and Holder Street is from 1992. Caltrans owns and operates the walkway, and the City is responsible for anything above the walkway. The City was unaware of its responsibility for this area.

For Beach Boulevard, Caltrans agreement with the City has been in place since 1971 and is still in effect. Maintenance agreements and encroachment permits by Caltrans are required for merchants to be able to clean the landscape areas. The City has the right to maintain the landscape in the condition it was built, but not modify or update the conditions. Further, any improvements would have to be funded by the City.

After further discussion, City Council directed staff to return with information regarding who has the ability to beautify the pedestrian overpass bridge near Corey Elementary School with designs or artwork and provide the information in the City Manager's Weekly.

19. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION REGARDING RESIDENTIAL OPTIONS FOR BLOCK WALLS ALONG SILVERADO TRAIL

Presented by: Aaron France, Assistant City Manager

Assistant City Manager France summarized the staff report for City Council noting the estimated costs to construct a block wall for each residence along the Silverado Trail is between \$15,000 and \$20,000.

Dave Wilson, Buena Park resident, stated he lives along the Silverado Trail and with the addition of the trail there has been an increase of pedestrian traffic, but no extra patrol by police department. People look into his home as they walk by and there was a homeless person living on the trail. Mr. Wilson expressed safety concerns.

City Council discussed the following: number of homes impacted by the trail improvements, creating standards for requesting wall replacements, whether home improvement funds are eligible for this type of improvement, and creating a loan program using one-time funds.

City Council directed staff to return with options for both a City paid program and a City loan program.

Assistant City Manager France reported that a formal proposal for improvements to the Main Conference Room was obtained in order to provide for the live-streaming of the Study Session portion of the City Council Meeting. A second option was proposed which would repurpose some equipment from the Council Chamber that is not utilized for the Main Conference Room.

City Council discussed options, costs associated with the options, and the reasons for holding Study Session in the Main Conference Room versus the Council Chamber.
