

## HOW DO I GET A LOG NUMBER OR A VISITOR'S PERMIT?

Buena Park residents must contact the Police Department to obtain a loading/unloading log number or visitor's permit. There is no charge for the log number or visitor's permit. You will need to provide the following information:

your name, address and phone number,

vehicle make and model,

location where the vehicle will be parked, and

the vehicle license plate number.

You can obtain a log number by calling (714) 562-3901. You will need to come to the Buena Park Police Department at 6650 Beach Boulevard for a visitor's permit.

# New RV and Trailer Parking Regulations



## RECREATIONAL VEHICLE (RV) ORDINANCE

The City of Buena Park recently passed a recreational vehicle (RV) ordinance (BPMC 10.24.040) relating to parking on city streets. To assist in understanding the ordinance, the following is a list of commonly asked questions.

## WHO IS AFFECTED BY THIS ORDINANCE?

Anyone who parks their RVs, boats, trailers or oversized vehicles (exceeds 22 feet in length or 84 inches in width) on the street is affected by the new parking ordinance.

## WHAT DOES THE NEW ORDINANCE SAY?

No person shall park and leave standing on any public street, any public or dedicated alley or any other public property a recreational vehicle, unattached trailer, unattached slide-in camper or oversized vehicle except as described herein.



## WILL I BE ABLE TO PARK ON THE STREET TO LOAD AND UNLOAD?

Yes. You are allowed two days (48 hours) for loading and unloading, and the RV or trailer must be parked in the street in front of the owner's home. You will need to contact the Buena Park Police Department at (714) 562-3901 to obtain a log number and expiration date. The log number must be prominently displayed in the front window of the RV to which it applies.



## IF I HAVE VISITORS, CAN THEY PARK THEIR RV ON THE STREET?

Yes, visitors need a permit from the Police Department to park their RVs on the street. The permit is good for seven consecutive days, but the RV must be parked on the street adjacent to the home being visited. It cannot be parked in front of someone else's home. Six permits are allowed per household per year.

## WHAT ABOUT OTHER PARKING REGULATIONS?

This ordinance does not override existing parking laws, signs or curb markings that prohibit or limit parking, including street sweeping.
