

**CITY OF BUENA PARK  
SENIOR CITIZENS COMMISSION MEETING  
February 26, 2015**

**CALL TO ORDER:** Chair Reynolds called the Senior Citizens Commission meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., City Council Chambers, 6650 Beach Boulevard, Buena Park, California.

**1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Minutes of January 22, 2015.**

**2. PUBLIC COMMENT:** Commission Liaison, Virginia Vaughn was present for this meeting.

**3. DIRECTOR'S/STAFF REPORT:**

- a. Veterans Banner Reimbursement - Mark Saucedo, Community Services Supervisor, reported that there has not been any change since the last reporting period. The remaining balance stands at \$2,303.37. Staff also received \$600.00 from the Silverado Days Grant.
- b. iPad Class for Seniors Taught by BPHS Students – Mr. Saucedo reported on the success of the iPad classes taught by Club Technicolor - volunteer students from Buena Park High School. This class is free to seniors and is offered on select Friday's from 2:30 p.m. – 3:30 p.m. The last class had forty (40) seniors participate. This class will continue in the month of April.
- c. Renewal of Vows in Ehlers Plaza - Mr. Saucedo reported that four (4) couples had participated in the renewal of their vows in the newly renovated outdoor Ehlers Plaza. Anniversaries ranged from thirteen(13) years on up to thirty (30) years. This was a well attended event that occurs every five years.

program. Commissioner Moore seconded. With no further discussion, the motion was carried.

- c. Floor issue in Dining Room - Mr. Saucedo reported that staff is waiting to receive a third bid. The floor is buckling and has affected the dining portion of the room. As a precaution, the room will be blocked off for repair. Staff wants to ensure the room is still accessible for the seniors to participate in classes.
